

Nat Cat features and needs

Definition

An event that causes major complex

claims in a limited geographical area

that can be more or less extended.

NAT CAT

Needs

Insured

Stop the state of emergency asap

Get the support in managing the emergency and in the technical solution of problems

Receive a technical and logistic support for interventions on partially damaged risks, granting the quality of the intervention and the financial coverage

Get a clear information about the possible reimbursement of expenses incurred and timing for those who have totally lost a property

Insurer

Get IMMEDIATE INFORMATION about the extent of the event in terms of risks involved and damages, including the probable ECONOMIC IMPACT for B.I.

Be CONSTANTLY UPDATED on the risks, activities, alleged costs and timing (cash flow prediction)

CARRY OUT ANY MITIGATION ACTIVITY for both direct and indirect damages

PARTICIPATE ACTIVELY in deciding the technical aspects

MANAGE THE MEDIA IMPACT to their own advantage

Be the centre of attention of the Insurer



PROBLEMS

KNOWLEDGE

Several risks affected simultaneously

Difficulty of communication with the insureds

INFORMATION

Lack or incompleteness of information about the risks potentially involved and their distribution on the territory

CONTEXT

Social context and media pressure

TERRITORY

Definition of the risk involved and their distribution on the territory

Difficulty of access

Problem with languages


Danger during access

TIME

It's essential to be professional, punctual in the responses and collaborative in the decisions reducing as much as possible the time factor


